- [ScannaR](#) The ScannaR is a talking reading machine to enable those who are unable to read to hear the content of books, newspapers, articles, etc.
- [Envelope writing guide](#) An envelope writing guide helps a person with visual impairment to write the lines of the address separately and in a neat line.
- [Reading guides](#) A reading aid for the partially sighted, to reduce glare on a page.
- [Signature writing guide](#) Signature guides help a person with no eyesight to write their signature in the appropriate place on legal documents, cheques and letters etc.
- [Wallet with signature guide](#) Wallet that consists of both - a handy note check that will enable a person with visual impairment to identify the note, and a signature guide to guide on where to sign.
- [Writing frames](#) Help guide the hand of a person with visual impairment to help you write in a straight line.
