

Deafblind manual alphabet

Also known as finger-spelling, the Deafblind Manual Alphabet is a method of spelling out words onto a deafblind person's hand. Each letter is denoted by a particular sign or place on the hand. [Watch the video.](#)

Although it does take some time to learn, the manual alphabet is faster to use than block and more commonly used. The method of creating each letter is shown below:
